



## Claymills Victorian Pumping Station

### Access Statement

April 2017

### Introduction

Claymills Victorian Pumping Station is situated on the outskirts of Burton on Trent off the A5121 and approximately ½ mile from the A38.

The pumping station was completed in 1885 and originally pumped sewage from Burton upon Trent to farmland about 3 miles away. There are 4 large beam engines and many auxiliary steam engines. More than 20 engines are operational on steaming days. There have been very few changes to the engines and machinery since the pumping station was opened so it retains its essential character as a masterpiece of Victorian industrial achievement.

The museum provides an all-weather venue.

Claymills Victorian Pumping Station is VAQAS accredited.

The only areas of the museum that cannot be accessed by wheelchairs are the upper floors of the engine houses.

On steaming days, a live video link to CD Engine house is available for those visitors who are unable to access the upper floors of the engine house.

### Pre-arrival

The nearest railway station is Burton on Trent, which is approximately 2½ miles away.

The X38 (Burton to Derby) direct bus service passes the end of Meadow Lane in both directions every 15mins. The nearest stops are the Beech Hotel and the A38 junction. Both are approximately 15mins walk to the pumping station.

Roads in the vicinity are level and paved. There is a railway level crossing on Meadow Lane which must be traversed by all modes of transport and pedestrians.

## **Car Parking and Arrival**

From the A38, take the north Burton (CLAY MILLS) exit and follow the A5121 towards Burton.

When approaching from the south, take care - the exit slip has a sharp 180° bend. Meadow Lane is approximately ½ mile from the junction.

Look for the brown signs at the A38 junction and again at Meadow Lane.

From Burton town centre, follow signs for Derby (A38).

After passing Arnold Clark's motorstore, watch out for the brown sign at Meadow Lane.

On steaming days, free parking is available approximately 50m from the site. Blue badge holders may park on the road between the car park and entrance gate.



On non-steaming days, free parking is available on-site; please park and come straight to the Stokers Rest Café.

## **Main Entrance and Reception Area**

The gate house is only used on steaming days when there is an admission charge. The doors are double width and the reception desk has a lowered section. A volunteer will come out to you if you require any assistance.



## The Site

The surfacing of the grounds is mostly level, but uneven in places.

Both AB and CD engine houses have a step into the entrance lobbies. Access to the upper levels are via either a spiral staircase or a staircase with a 90° turn halfway up.

Entrances to the workshop, boiler house and E engine house are level access. There is a short ramp into the 130 house, which is a multipurpose room used for functions, displays and children's activities etc.

Information around the site is displayed on portable lecterns which may be moved to provide uncluttered photographic opportunities. On steaming days, additional videos and rolling photo displays are shown in the 130 house.

Volunteers can assist and answer any questions in all locations.



## **Public Toilets**

The male toilet is located adjacent to the Stokers Rest Café and has a single step. The female and wheelchair accessible toilets are accessed from within the café.

## **Shop and Visitor Centre**

The Stokers Rest Café has a short ramp up to the double width doors and is always open during normal museum opening times.

Hot and cold drinks and cold snacks are available in addition to a variety of books, clothing & memorabilia.

On steaming days, a selection of hot snacks, sandwiches, cakes etc. are also available.

A wide variety of books, magazines, videos etc are available in our bookshop.

An 8 minute video presentation showing the site in operation can be viewed on request.

## **Additional Information**

Dogs are welcome and water is provided.

We have one wheelchair available if required.

Guided tours are available according to a timetable on steaming days or on request.

## **Future plans**

We are planning to build a new visitor centre and also improve the surface of the yard.
